In "No Markdowns Here!" Hal Brady of Dallas, Texas, tells the story of a "young man who came to a pastor and said he wanted to be a Christian. The pastor instructed him to read the Book of Acts as preparation for this important decision. Weeks passed, but the young man did not return. The pastor began to think he had made a serious mistake in his suggestion. Finally, almost a year later, the young man appeared. When the surprised pastor asked where he had been, the man said, 'You told me to read the Book of Acts. Every time I started to read it, it told me to do something. So, I stopped reading and went and did it. I have just been too busy to get back!'"



Leaders in the church know something that they may not often share with others. It is that they - lay leaders, church school teachers, music directors, pastors and many others - were profoundly affected by a week spent at church camp when they were teenagers. If one asks what impressed them most during a week in a forest or by a lake or wherever the camp was held, they would answer, "Everything!"
