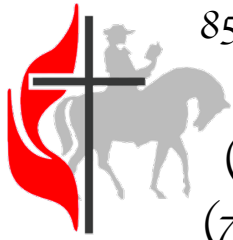

From the Pastor's Pen

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego replied to the king, O Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to defend ourselves before you in this matter. If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to save us from it, and he will rescue us from your hand, o king. But even if he does not we want to know, o king, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up" Daniel 3:16-18

One of the most frustrating experiences believers encounter occurs when we find ourselves being persecuted ostracized, in trouble, or suffering when we are trying to do the right thing. We can't help but ask, Why? After all if we are doing the right thing, God ought to make our lot easier than what it is and shield and protect us from those who would do us harm. Why are the evil allowed to give the good so much hell? I cannot and would not dare to try to answer all of the questions about the suffering of the righteous at the hands of the wicked. but there are several things to remember when we have to face persecution for doing the right thing.

First when we do the right thing there will be things we naturally are against and people we naturally oppose based upon who we are, what we *believe in*, and what we *stand for*. *The Nebuchadnezzar's of our lives still build monuments to their limited power. They demand that if we love them, are loyal to them, want to get alone with them, or be their friend, or if we want to advance your career or save our job or our benefits, we must bow down and worship them, sleep with them, kiss*

up to them, or support them in what we know is wrong. If we have standards or convictions about what is right or wrong, if our soul and our integrity mean something to us, if our self-respect is not negotiable if our faith and our religion have said this, far and no father,' then some things we will be against and some people will oppose. Life will demand the we take a stand and make choices.

Everyday life and the devil will test us to see how far they can push us, how much we will bend, if we will break, and much we are willing to take. When there is moral warfare going on there are no safe and secure positions of neutrality.

When we decide to take a stand on anything we will discover two things. Some ask, Why can't we all just get along? Because we're not all for the same things. And when we take a stand we discover that there are consequences for our taking a stand. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego refused to worship Nebuchadnezzar's god and were thrown into the fiery furnace. But God was with them and rescued them from the consuming fire. When we do right, God will bless us. God will prepare a table for us in front of our enemies. And people will resent us being blessed and persecute us. Let us enjoy our blessings. For if we're doing the right thing, God's blessing will come our way. Shadrach Meshach, and Abednego had an unwavering faith. They knew what was right, no matter the consequences. When facing persecution for doing the right we have to be prepared to go all the way with right. Right is the right thing to do because it's right. We have all been to the mountain top and we all have been in the furnace. When we're in the furnace we may not see God or hear God speak, but God is still with us. How do we know? Because we are surviving in the furnace that was supposed to destroy us. We're walking around in the traps where enemies thought they had bound us. We're walking through that mess that was supposed to discredit us. We're being blessed in the very fire that have consumed us, Shadrach Meshach, and Abednego walked out of the furnace. They finally have a bid on equipment for all three doors in the education wing, that includes locking and unlocking systems, cameras and monitors for \$1849.00. We are now trying to find a way to pay for the equipment. We have been assured that the installation can be handled by the trustees.

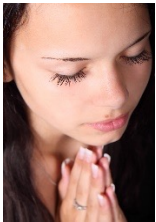

United Methodist Women/Just a little history Shared from the United Methodist women handbook.

God’s mission has been on the heart of our members throughout the organization’s history. With faith, hope and love, women have been responding to God’s call in their lives: The women who anointed Jesus’ head with precious perfume: Ester, who despite her social standing, boldly proclaimed Christ and brought salvation to her community are all among the ranks of faith-filled




women. They are part of a long chain of prayerful, loving, giving, courageous, caring and compassionate women who might have been called bold, brash, radical, unorthodox or even unreasonable and have faithfully lived out God’s

mission in the world. They lived by grace and set the example for our foremothers who met in 1869 at the church on Tremont street in Boston ,who displayed wisdom and collected the resources to send the first women missionaries to India.


Likewise, Isabella Thoburn and Dr. Clara Swain answered the call to serve women in India at a time when women with little means had neither status nor standing in society: Theresa Hoover raised up women leaders in the 1950’s and went on to be the deputy general secretary of the women’s Division of the United Methodist Church: and Virginia Laskey Established a scholarship fund for theological education

For women and continued the tradition of breaking out of confining structures that impede God’s ongoing mission.
