

Health/Nutritional Education—Rwanda – A nutritional education program for follow up in the community where children have been treated for malnutrition. Without education many children are readmitted with the same problems. There is a need for almost 1500 groups where malnutrition is the main cause of morbidity and mortality of children under age 5. This project would provide the addition of 30 groups and transportation cost for one year to supervise the groups.

Goal: \$2,000

Construction of pre-school– Sudan – A Sudanese believer, would return to Sudan to oversee the building of a pre-school for 100 children to receive basic general and Christian education. They would also receive essential nutrition through school meals.

Goal: \$3,000

COTTAGE INDUSTRIES

Beauty Salon—Peru – Rosita Lopez is a talented woman who partners with her husband to pastor a vibrant, growing church in Comas, Peru. The start up cost for a beauty salon would provide a stable income for this effective leader and witness to the women of the community. **Goal: \$3,000**

Micro-Enterprise—Kenya - The women of the Free Methodist Church of Kenya request assistance in developing small micro-enterprise projects to supplement their family income and build funds for Women's ministry. Projects would include: Purchasing a cow to raise and then give the first offspring to another woman; purchasing bulk quantities of material or seed, rice, etc. for re-sale and profit making; or starting a small business center or training center for vocational skills. (Project money would be divided out per district based on project proposals.) **Goal: \$2,000**

Coffee Cart—Peru – An ordained elder in the Tacna, Peru Free Methodist Church, is a single pastor wanting to provide a way to support herself as an itinerant minister. With the Coffee Cart, Geovanna can reach out to effectively disciple other young leaders and also provide a model for other women pastors/leaders throughout Latin America. **Goal: \$2,000**

Sewing Machines—India – Groups of FM women in the villages of India are being taught skills in tailoring to help the family income. Each class needs two or three sewing machines and contributions toward the teacher salary. Sewing machines are approximately \$100 each and are foot powered. **Goal: \$500**

Micro-Enterprise—Peru – A single mother and worship leader regularly supporting a new church plant in Lima, Peru, requests assistance in starting a micro-enterprise project of jewelry-making to support herself and her son. This would also provide a model for other micro enterprises in Latin America. **Goal: \$1,000**

Development Funds—World Wide—SEED – One of the functions of SEED is to encourage the development of new livelihood projects among those of our FM family who are most vulnerable economically. In order to accomplish this effectively SEED needs an ongoing Development Fund that can immediately respond with a small loan or grant as soon as a group has formed and is ready to begin operation. **Goal: \$1,800**

Widows' Training—Kenya – The FMC in Kenya has 250 widows providing care for orphans. By establishing groups for training sessions they will be empowered to attain financial stability. The first year of a 3-year program provide funds for transportation and assistance for the coordinator in establishing these groups. In the following years the women would then develop financial enterprises. **Goal: \$2,000**

MINISTRY

Bible for Every Believer—Asia – There are approximately 5,000 Asians baptized every year and often they do not have a Bible in their language. For \$5.00 per Bible these new believers will receive one in their own language. This will also help to provide Gospel tracts for major evangelistic efforts. **Goal: \$1,000**

Baby Formula—Kenya – Women who are HIV positive or have AIDS are unable to breastfeed their babies due to the risks involved. For many of these women the cost of formula is prohibitive. This project would assist in providing formula for these moms and their little ones. **Goal: \$2,000**

Support for Pastors' Widows—Egypt – When a pastor dies, his wife loses housing since they live in parsonages. The Egypt General Conference provide the widows with the equivalent of \$15.USD per month which doesn't even cover their medicines. This fund would enable the General Conference to triple the amount per month for 6 widows to \$45. **Goal: \$3,000**

Ladies Retreats—Mexico – The women's groups in Northern Mexico each have an annual retreat. These retreats spur on spiritual growth and leadership development. This year's emphasis is an added retreat for pastors' wives. The project request is for \$500 for travel expenses for each of the three retreats. **Goal: \$1,500**

Vacation Bible School—Egypt – The FM churches of Egypt minister to approximately 10,000 children each summer through VBS. For every \$1 given, a child will be able to attend a well resourced VBS and hear the "good news" of the Gospel. **Goal: \$3,000**

Christian Daycare—Romania – the Oaza FM organization is seeking funds to open a Christian community daycare for children ages 2-6. This project will provide funding for the purchase of tables, chairs and sleeping mattresses for the children served by the daycare. **Goal: \$1,500**

Food and Shelter—Puerto Rico – Area Director Delia Nüesch-Oliver has requested funds for food and shelter for the area leaders in Puerto Rico to attend conference. **Goal: \$3,000**

Discipling Four Iraqi Families—Iraq – The Dohuk, Iraq church is ministering to four families that live in villages outside the city. Through discipling these families, they equip them to duplicate themselves and begin more house churches. **Goal: \$1,440**

II Timothy 2:2 – WMI cooperates with Men's Ministries International in sponsoring national evangelists – many of whom are women. For \$200 a woman will receive the support needed. No monetary value can be placed on the souls that will be won and disciplined through these women. **Goal: \$600**

Project Barnabas – Supplies needed on the mission fields are donated by people all over the U.S. to the home base near Indianapolis, IN. and transported in large shipping containers to various mission fields. There is no shortage of supplies, but shipping costs are more than \$15 per cubic foot to get the items to the mission field. Men's Ministries International President Mark Whitlock states that the great cooperation of WMI has made the sending of these containers possible as our organizations work together. **Goal: \$1,500**

EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS

Teacher/Tutor Salary—Budapest – The Budapest Ministry Center wants to establish after-school tutoring for neighborhood elementary-age children, primarily in English language studies. This service would introduce families to the church fellowship. **Goal: \$1,000**

Scholarship—Greece – Elli Rustemi is an Albanian believer from a very poor family, taking medication twice daily for diabetes. She is a high school graduate and would like to attend university. She leads worship in Mike and Maria Longs's church. The goal is for Elli to enter University in the fall of 2010 after passing the Michigan and Cambridge English certificate. **Goal: \$1,500**

Women's Literacy Programs—India – Area Director David Yardy has requested that the WMI continue the very important project of helping hundreds of women learn to read through the Literacy Program. The minimal cost per month for 10 months is \$350 for each class of 10-15 women. **Goals: \$1,750 : \$1,750**
