From the desk of Pastor Mark Hollinger November 2018

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. As we approach Thanksgiving, I want to express my gratitude for Kathy and my reception and cooperation since we've arrived at Cridersville UMC. There is such a cooperative spirit and a vision and focus of being a community church as well as a vibrant worship center where God is glorified and people can become affirmed and grow in the way of Christ our Lord.

In order to maintain and further the ministries and fellowship of Cridersville UMC several events are about to be celebrated during our upcoming worship services. On Sunday, October 28th you will have received a Cridersville UMC Ministry Handbook with brief descriptions of the "grow and serve" ministry opportunities in the church. These include everything from being a part of Funeral Dinner Ministry, Ch-Ki-Lo, Sunday school and Worship duties (think Usher, Greeter, etc...). You have been invited to take these home and prayerfully consider and then fill out a commitment sheet for these ministries in the coming year of 2019. The commitment sheets will be collected on November 4th during worship and will be collected and available in the Sundays following at the Welcome Center.

The apostle Paul in his letters to the early churches he established instructs them as to the understanding that we are a body in Christ. Romans 12:4-6 *For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us.* Paul then further describes that each of us are called to serve the church with our differing gifts and passions. We are called to be Christians who have an active faith that is seen and known in the ministries of Cridersville UMC. These ministries offer us not only the opportunity to live out our call but to fully realize the blessings received in serving others and one another. Kathy and I look forward to committing our time and talent to the ministries of Cridersville UMC on November 4th.

And then on Sunday, November 18th we will have the opportunity to commit financially to the church for 2019. You will receive faith investment cards in the mail with the opportunity to either mail or bring them into the church or bring them forward as an act of worship and celebration on November 18 during our worship service. Throughout the Bible we are commanded to give back to the Lord a portion which we have received from the Lord. I encourage you to prayerfully consider your giving back to God through your financial commitments to the church and to increase your financial commitment from last year. If you are absent on this Sunday you will have the opportunity to register your financial commitments on the following Sundays at the Welcome center or at the church office.

In order to celebrate all of your commitments and faith investments into the 2019 ministries of Cridersville UMC we will have a catered meal on November 18th immediately following the worship service. On that Sunday, November 18th we will have Sunday school an hour earlier from 9:30 am to 10:15 am and then worship will begin at 10:30am with the meal following in the fellowship hall.

In both the Old and New Testaments we are instructed to give a tenth (10% of our total net income) of our earnings and/or gifts. It is my hope that we could all be moving toward that goal by annually increasing our giving to that goal, as we are able. This is a commitment and command that Kathy and I take very seriously and we look forward to making that financial commitment with you on November 18th.

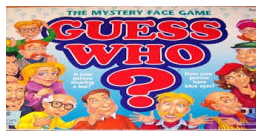

For the month of September, Ch-Ki-Lo Food Pantry served 26 households with minor children and 48 households without minor children. For a total number served of 74 households. Total people served with minor children was 150 and total people served without minor children was 56, for a total of 206 people served.

4. Donate **\$9** per box to help cover cost of shipping. If you cannot afford this, you can still pack a box.
5. Place a rubber band around your shoe box and bring to church by **Nov. 11**
