PASTOR JON'S COLUMN - Who is Going to Roll Away my Stone? - "Jesus, at your service!"


The women who were on the way to the tomb to embalm Jesus asked it. "Who will move the stone for us?" In order to complete the proper burial process they needed to get to the body of Jesus. And there was a big darn stone in the way. Rolled there to keep Jesus in? Of course, the scripture tells us that when they arrived their concern was misplaced. The stone had been removed.

In my experience, as I have traveled along my way, I have at times found myself separated from God. Sometimes I know where I'm going, sometimes I am unsure, and sometimes I cannot take the first step. There is a rock in my way -(or is it a landslide?) - and I am on the opposite side of some boulder, some stronghold that stands between me and God, between me and others . . . At times I can't even see past it, not to mention get 🐺 around it or go through it. Who will move that stone for me? Who will move that stone for you? The crazy thing about some stones: Often they are invisible, many times they are of no weight that gravity can grasp, but all too often they are crushing us, our spirits, our very lives.

Maybe, just maybe, yours is the stone of reason and of self-sufficiency. Oh, you may go to church — but to commit your life to something you can't see, and touch, and exactly prove that it exists? And there is no real concession for you — no heartfelt confession for you; because if you did, you would insult your own intellect — your own ability. If that is you, you stand in

good company! You are a true companion of Thomas, Doubting Thomas (more accurately "Unbelieving Thomas") – who said "Unless I see the nail holes in Jesus' hands, and place my hand in his side I will not believe." Is that you? Who will move the stronghold for you? Jesus has already done so and given you the freedom to come, see, doubt – believe!

Maybe you are standing behind a boulder of bitterness, a mound of



resentment, a pile of hatred. Things have happened along your way. Living itself has dealt you an incredible blow, and somewhere along the way you have concluded that it is God punishing you for something you did or didn't do. How could you trust a God like that? I wouldn't blame you — I didn't. God gets too much credit and too much blame for the stuff that happens in this world. Who can move this heavy burden from your

path? Jesus has already done so and given you the freedom to travel through – to yoke himself to you and lighten your load.

Maybe it's the stronghold of a rocky past – the weight of shame or the mass of guilt that prevents you from feeling good enough to be loved by God. You perhaps have never heard of the name "John Newton" but you have probably sung his song: "Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me I once was lost, but now I'm found was blind, but now I see." Newton became a minister after years in the slave trade, and would later tell his congregation "If God can love a wretch like me, he can surely love a wretch like you." If your life is littered with memories of dreadful words and deeds, broken relationships, unrealized dreams; loneliness . . . Who will remove that bag of dead flesh for you? Jesus has already done so and offers you the freedom to lighten vour load.

So, perhaps you are carrying the stone of self-reliance, or the stone of uncertainty, or the stone of pride, or the stone of fear, or the stone of hatred; how about the stone of resentment — unable to move past hurts of the past — and you are drained, so exhausted from carrying it through this life. Who will take this weight off your shoulders? Who will remove the barrier between you and the Creator God? Jesus has already done so.

Brothers and sisters – whatever *your* stone is, I will tell you who removed it. Jesus, the Risen One, that's who.

You see, it doesn't matter what our stone looks like, or what it's called, or what it is made of; whether a pebble, a rock, a slab of concrete, a full-on landslide. We are all in the same rubble. At the core of the pile is our sin that stands between us and God. We can't move it. We can't change it. We can't get to God by going over it, around it or through it. But Jesus can, and Jesus has. This is the decisive reality of Easter; that the stone which had blocked humankind from God for generations was blown to bits on the day of Resurrection. Jesus stands ready with a hard hat of salvation and a jackhammer powered by the love and grace of the Holy Spirit – Jesus – at your service!


