CALL TO WORSHIP

PASTOR: Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God. The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light:

CONGREGATION: *They that dwell in the land of the shadow of death, upon them hath the light shined.*

PASTOR: Speak ye comfortably to Jerusalem, and cry unto her, that her warfare is accomplished, that her iniquity is pardoned:

CONGREGATION: *The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.*

PASTOR: Every valley shall be exalted, and every mountain and hill shall be made low: and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough places plain:

The carol "God Rest Ye Merry, Gentlemen" was the most popular of the early carols, sung for centuries before being published in Britain in 1833. The author is unknown. It is not addressed to "merry gentlemen." The words of the song had different meanings in the time of its writing than in contemporary use; *rest* meant "keep," while *merry* meant "mighty" or "strong" (i.e., Merrie Old England meant *Mighty* Old England, Robin Hood's merry men were *mighty* men) Thus, the title in modern English means "May God keep you gentlemen strong, or mighty." The message of the song is God's news of comfort and joy to keep us strong in spite of conditions in this world that might dismay us.
