A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANI:

As we approach the second month of this new year, I'm thinking about New Year Resolutions. Did you make one for yourself? Have you tried to keep up with it? Sometimes folks will come up with a Word of the Year rather than create a new goal or resolution. If someone picks a word to focus on throughout the year, they will try to find ordinary and extraordinary moments in their life where that word or theme comes up. For instance, some folks will choose to look for the presence of **peace** in the upcoming year. Choosing to look for the presence of peace may end up helping someone become more thankful for the moments in their life that bring them peace, or they may even feel more peaceful in the new year. Choosing a theme or a word for one's new year could potentially become a type of resolution, as the theme helps one change or at least reflect more on the positive moments in their life. Did you pick a word for this new year, or this new decade? Maybe you chose to reflect on:

Joy, Creativity, Foundation, Inspiration, Laughter, Balance, Exploration, Freedom, Calm, or Simplicity

For the past month, I've reflected on **hospitality**. Hospitality, throughout the years, has become commercialized and monetized. The hospitality we receive in customer service, while it is nice to receive, is reserved for folks who can pay for it. However, the hospitality we are called to embody in the church, is reserved for all God's creatures and creation. Hospitality offered by the church is not contingent on whether or not someone can afford a hotel room or a meal, but is instead offered to *all*. The hospitality God calls the church to offer requires relationship as we offer and/or receive hospitality when we are in relationships or in community with each other. True and holy hospitality offered in relationship does not depend on what one may receive as a result of offering compassionate welcome. Hospitality is offered simply for offering hospitality and for no other reason. In his description on how to faithfully illustrate one's love for God, Paul writes to the Romans: "Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; *extend hospitality to strangers*" (Romans 12:9-13). Paul reminds us that our love for God shows up in our love for neighbor, particularly in the hospitality we offer to our neighbors and to the world.

While I've spent time reflecting on the presence of hospitality in my life in the first month, I've inevitably thought a lot about you: Centennial UMC at Ivy! You have extended your love to my family and I in my first month as pastor and I'm incredibly grateful for the love and kindness you have already offered to me. Many of you have offered your expertise and knowledge about Centennial which has thoroughly helped me settle into this new role. Others have welcomed my husband Erik, and my parents in worship and fellowship following worship. And many of you have offered me grace and patience in this transition. Know that I am grateful for you and thankful for your love. And regardless of whatever word or goal you set for yourself this year, I pray that the transforming love of God will guide you and empower you in the coming year.

May the God of manna in the desert, wellsprings in the wilderness, honey from the rock, wine from the water: may this God provide what you most need for the work

God most desires for you.*

Centennial UMC Choir Rehearses every Tuesday from 7 pm to 8pm!


Please don't worry if you cannot make every week. We will practice each anthem several times.




