

ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The 176th Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church was held June 7-11 at Hy-Vee Hall. Representing Centennial were Pastor Wendy, Libby and Don Hiatt, Gaylen Heaberlin, Brandi Jackson and Brooke Person.

On the evening of June 7, the Clergy and Laity sessions were held. The Laity session, "Love God and Your Neighbor" and its concurrent Clergy session kick off the Conference each year. The Laity participated in four short workshops which provided practical information on important topics that can be used in congregations. They were: Connecting Your Church to the World; Making Missions Exciting in the Local Church! Disaster Preparedness and Response, From Entertaining to Empowering Youth and How Exposure to Nature Will Change Your Life; Churches and Camps Partnering.

On Saturday, eight workshops were conducted: Multiethnic Churches, Mental Health Collation Building, Mental Health Task Force, The Gift of Conflict, Creating a New Community of Faith in Your Community, Freeing the Spirit in Your Community, The Joy of Laity for a Small-Town Family Doctor and Setting the Course for Retirement Readiness. Throughout the Conference, delegates and alternates for the 2020 General Conference and Jurisdictional Conference were elected. The 75th anniversary of the Heifer Project, the 150 anniversary of United Methodist Women and the 200th anniversary of United Methodist missions were all celebrated. A gathering and meal for United Methodist Women was held at Wesley United Methodist Church on Sunday.

On Monday, a peace walk, "Making Peace in our Church, in Our World and in Ourselves" was held at the Peace Garden at Cowles Commons. Throughout the Conference, five offerings were collected for Ubuntu Retreat Centre Kitchen Fund, 2019 disaster relief, Mt. Hope United Methodist Church and their outreach ministries, Mental Health Task Force and the Diakonos. (The Diakonos are 32 high school students who serve in many capacities during Annual Conference. More than one has felt the call to ministry over the years.)

Conference Treasurer, Maggie Biggs, focused on statistical information from 2013 through 2018 and the 2020 proposed budget: average worship attendance had a decline of 8,809 worshippers, number of members had a reduction of 349, participation in Sunday school, youth and young adult groups, etc. had a sharp decline of 11,039, mission engagement went from 17,932 to 27,012, Stewardship declined by \$6.7 million, reduction of District Offices will save approximately \$600,000-\$700,000, three Conference missions were reduced \$565,000 and due to the drop-in apportionment payments, there was a short fall of \$1.5 million.

Eight churches closed in the past year: First United Methodist Church, Ottumwa, Little Cedar United Methodist Church, St. Ansgar, Living Water United Methodist Church, Marion, Noble United Methodist Church, Griswald, Sharpsburg United Methodist Church, Sharpsburg, Wesley United Methodist Church, Ottumwa, Willard St. United Methodist Church, Ottumwa and Yale United Methodist Church, Yale.

The last order of business before the close of the Conference was the Fixing of Appointments. Centennial was designated "delayed appointment".
