#### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANI:

One year ago, on March 15, more than 60 of us gathered in the church sanctuary for worship. It was the last time we worshipped together inside the sanctuary without masks, without social distancing guidelines, and without knowing anyone who had died from COVID-19. The terms *global pandemic, physical distancing, quarantine,* and *unprecedented* were not part of our everyday vocabulary.

On March 15th, though, many of us gathered like it was a regular Sunday. But it wasn't. It was the last time we would be together before this global pandemic. It was the last time we would worship together until eleven months later when a small group of us gathered for the first indoor worship in February 2021. And perhaps more importantly, it was a day of celebration for the Maxwell-Bowie family as we baptized Afton James Maxwell, who was only one month old at the time!

On that day, reciting from the hymnal, we declared that we would nurture and surround Afton with love and forgiveness as her church family. Together we said we would pray for her, witness her growth, and help her live according to the example of Christ. It's what we say to all people baptized in our beautiful & historic church. You said it to Afton's sister Oakley a few years before and to many others who have entered the doors of Centennial.





I invite you to take a look at these pictures of Afton. I know many of us haven't been able to see her sweet face since last March due to the pandemic but look at how much she has changed since her baptism. She's grown so much: her hair is longer, her eyes are wider and browner, and she has a wide smile that lights up any room. It's been an entire year since she was baptized and so much has changed in her life. And yet we, as a church, commit to the very same things we committed to on March 15. Even though she has changed so much, we are *still* committed to nurturing and surrounding her with love and forgiveness. We will continue to pray for her, watch her grow and change and, with God's help, encourage her to live according to the example of Christ.


In the coming years, Afton will also teach us how to live according to the example of Christ, as the world's youth continues modeling for us how to be kinder and more compassionate neighbors. Children and youth teach us, through their love, how to be better disciples of Jesus Christ from their softness that hasn't turned yet into the hard edges that prevent us from loving abundantly and without exception.

The many changes in Afton's life over the past year illustrate how in this last year, we have **all** changed. When the same group of us that were present for Afton's baptism return to in-person worship, we will not be the same people. It's inevitable. It's been a lonnnnng year that caused us to focus more on survival than perhaps we ever have. We have had to rely more on each other in new ways and we are not the same people that we were on March 15, 2020 when we gathered for worship.

And maybe that's ok. It's ok that we changed. We had to, in order to survive and provide for ourselves and our families this year.

But our commitment stays the same. Even as changed people, we continue to commit ourselves to nurturing and surrounding one another in love and forgiveness and understanding. We continue to pray for each other, watch each other change and grow, and help one another live according to the example of Christ. I'm convinced that there may not be any work better in this world than the work of surrounding each other in love, through every change and trial we encounter. Thanks be to God.

# We now offer worship inside our sanctuary with guidelines to help keep us safe. Please read below before attending worship in our sanctuary.



A caring family of disciples who know Christ and make Christ known in our community and around the world.



In order to safely re-enter the building for worship, we have multiple regulations that we must all take seriously in an effort to keep us safe and healthy. See below for a list of regulations and restrictions as we begin indoor worship soon. We hope you'll join us with a mask & a willingness to experiment together.

#### **INDOOR WORSHIP & SANCTUARY SEATING GUIDELINES:**

- Do not attend any in-person meeting or gathering if you do not feel well or have any symptoms of COVID-19.
- Capacity for the sanctuary is set currently at 36 participants for safety reasons. This number is difficult to define and is somewhat flexible as families are welcome to sit together, but folks who are not related to each other must sit 6-feet apart.
- Like the rest of the building, masks are required in the sanctuary until further notice. Hand sanitizer will be made available for you before and after the service.
- Ushers will greet you at the door before you enter the church building. Ushers will hand you a bulletin and assist you in finding the best place to sit that is distanced from those you are not related to.
- If we reach capacity in the sanctuary, we will then seat folks distanced in the narthex. If the narthex reaches capacity, then we will use seating in the fellowship hall where folks can watch the service on the TV and hear it through the radio that we will provide. Folks are welcome to continue worshipping in their cars (tune your radio to 88.5 to worship along with us), or online.
- Every other pew is marked as not occupiable, beginning with the first row of each aisle. Please abide by these restrictions when you enter the sanctuary by sitting only in rows that are not marked off by tape or ribbon.
- Non-family members in the same pew need to sit physically distanced from the other. The CDC recommends 6 ft. Two or three individuals could sit distanced in the same pew. Again, an usher will assist you.
- Ushers will also dismiss families and individuals at the end of the service. Please do not get up to leave without an usher dismissing you. This helps us keep everyone moving safely and reminds us all that we cannot gather indoors for fellowship after service. Please feel free to chat with one another at a safe distance outdoors after the service.
- Online worship will continue to be made available every week. Our website, ivycentennial.org has all worship links in the "Sermon Videos" tab.
- We will also continue to worship through the radio. So, if you'd like to join us, while staying in the safety of your car, you can join us on Sunday mornings by parking in our parking lot by 10:30am and tuning your radio to 88.5 FM.

#### **INDOOR MEETING GUIDELINES AT IVY:**

- Do not attend any in-person meeting or gathering if you do not feel well or have any symptoms of COVID-19.
- Masks are required at all gatherings at Ivy until further notice. Masks are located in the church narthex if you need one anytime that you are at the church.
- Check the church calendar before scheduling a meeting to ensure availability. Our church calendar can be found on our website: <u>ivycentennial.org</u>.
- To post your meeting on our church calendar, please email Jeff Freel or Pastor Dani.

- Please provide an opportunity for meeting attendees to access your scheduled meeting via Zoom or another online meeting format even when meeting in-person at the church. Ask Pastor Dani if you need help setting up a Zoom meeting ahead of time.
- Write down names and contact information of each person who attends your in-person meeting or gathering in case someone from the meeting is later diagnosed with COVID 19 and all who attended need to be notified.
- Please do not share food or drinks in the church building. If you'd like to have food at your meeting, please encourage everyone to bring their own.
- Physical distancing is required at all gatherings and meetings.
- Please wipe down all objects (chairs, tables, etc.) after the conclusion of your meeting. Each meeting space has its own container of cleaning wipes for your use.
- Capacity limits have been identified for each room and meeting space at the church. The capacity limits are posted on the door of each room. Please abide by these capacity limits.
- Fellowship Hall: 30 (no more than 3 chairs to a table)
- Sanctuary: 36
- Upstairs kitchen: 4
- Library: 4
- Downstairs kitchen: 4
- Nursery: 10
- Sunday School Room 1: 4
- Sunday School Room 2: 12
- Youth Room: 15
- Narthex: 0. The narthex cannot be used for gathering until further notice.

Please only use the narthex as you are on your way to and from the sanctuary.


Whether you are an lowa State fan or an lowa fan, you might be interested in reading "Football's Fallen Hero-The Jack Trice Story" by Steven Jones. It is a true story of lowa State's first black athlete, Jack Trice. It relates Trice's time at lowa State College in Ames through the day he died from injuries sustained during a football game against the Minnesota Gophers on Oct. 6, 1923. Years went by and Trice was forgotten. Then in 1973, there was a renewed interest in him and in 1997,

after a twenty-five-year struggle, Iowa State University dedicated Jack Trice Stadium in honor of the man who was expected do big things.

"My thoughts just before the first real college game of my life: the honor of my race, family and self is at stake. Everyone is expecting me to do big things. I will." - Jack Trice

Another new book that can be found in the church library is Everybody Always: Becoming Love in a World Full of Setbacks and Difficult People by Bob Goff. The book was the basis of Pastor Dani's message on January 10<sup>th</sup>.

This book is a simple life statement. We were created to love everybody, always. This includes those who are hard to love and even those we are afraid of. We find it a little (or even a lot) creepy. The author shares his own stories of simple ways to love others.
