


Centennial United Methodist Church at Ivy

Missions

We have had a good year and hope to finish it up with a successful warm wear drive. We started the year with the Heifer project which raised over 1600 dollars. Carissa Bowie went on a mission's trip and the congregation helped raise over 1000 with sending toothbrushes. dollars along toothpaste, and eveglasses with her. We also had a great group of 15 package Meals for Heartland. They boxed 90 boxes of Meals which = 19440 Meals! Also the first Sunday of the month is Food pantry Sunday. So far this year there have been 1157 items collected. Finishing the year off, we had Unicef Trunk or Treat. During the months of November and part of December we do a warm wear drive for Bidwell. We will collect new or gently used hats, gloves, scarves and coats.

Fellowship, Family Ministries, and Evangelism

Fellowship has been a long standing tradition at Ivy. It allows friends and family to meet after worship and catch up from the week while having a nice treat. This is an important tradition and goes along with Dinner Day hosts. We are always looking for people to sign up for Fellowship. For first timers, any member of the committee would love to help you. All you need to do is plan to bring something as simple as cookies and prepare the coffee! It is pretty amazing to see everyone lend a hand at clean up and see the men doing dishes. There are still a few dates left this year. All you need to do is sign up on the board in the Hall.

EDUCATION

Education has seen some changes this year. Last spring we tried moving Sunday School during church service in hopes of capturing a larger audience. The committee felt it was a success and kept the same time frame this fall. We currently are doing the teaching on a rotation basis to allow everyone to hear service and also lend a hand teaching. If you are interested in helping teach, please let a committee member now. We provide the lesson book and activity. Normally each class has 2 'teachers' and makes it easy to catch on.

It is the great congregation at Ivy that makes our church what it is. No matter how young or old, consider lending a hand. There will be enough support to help you.

WORSHIP

The responsibility of the worship committee is to help the congregation strengthen their relationship to God through acts of worship. There are nine members on the committee.

Some of our responsibilities are: providing ushers for worship services, preparing and helping serve communion, helping prepare the sanctuary and services for Advent and Lent, relate to the choir with the purchase of new music and upkeep of the piano and organ, care and display of paraments, prepare for baptisms, coordinate Advent and Lenten mailings to the surrounding community, supply the Upper Room devotionals, upkeep of the attendance pads, consider purchase of new hymnals and Bibles and help plan and carry out special Sundays such as Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Easter and Christmas Eve.

PASTORAL AND STAFF COMPENSATION

The Pastor Parish Committee is responsible for a large portion of Centennial's finances. committee with the help of the District Superintendent determines the salary of the Pastor and other expenses that occur with that position. The committee is also responsible for determining the salaries of the other three paid positions of the Church which are the Pianist/ Organist. Secretary and Custodian. These four salaries make up nearly half of the our 2018 budget. The Pastor along with the other three positions are vital for the week-in and week-out functioning of our Little White Church. This all adds up to \$43,637 which amounts to 49.3% of the budget. Like Trustees and Apportionments the Pastoral and Staff Portion of the budget are pretty much out of our control.
