"IT'S NOT ROCKET SCIENCE"

As an adult, there are a few phrases that echo in my mind from childhood. Growing up, whenever my dad, a teacher or a coach was talking to me about <u>thinking</u> in a new way, or <u>acting</u> in a different way, they would often say *"Darrel, it's not rocket science"* as a means of encouraging me that what they were saying was not difficult, and that I could understand it, and I could do it.

That phrase echoed in my mind as I listened to the Bishops recent Vision Cast. If your congregation hasn't listened to it yet, go to <u>www.fmcusa.org/live</u> and watch it. If you've never listened to a Vision Cast before, I urge you to listen to this one.

The Bishops began by saying that the **Mission of the FMC** comes directly from Jesus. And our bishops have made our FM Mission really easy for us to remember, because they have summarized Jesus' words into just **3 phrases** of **6 words...**

"Love God"(Great Commandment, part 1 – Matt. 22:37 – 38)"Love People"(Great Commandment, part 2 – Matt. 22:39 - 40)"Disciple Others"(Great Commission – Matt 28:18 – 20)

Do you think the ADULTS in your congregation could remember those 3 phrases? What about your TEENS? And what about your CHILDREN? What do you think would happen if every person in your congregation was challenged to MEMORIZE those three phrase? And what might happen if everyone in your church was challenged to not only remember those three phrases, but also to look each day for at least one way to LIVE THEM OUT? What stories might we be able to share with one another? What adventures might we experience?

Next, let's take our Mission a step further. What might happen if these three phrases were also used as priorities for evaluating our church ministries and maximizing our church resources –

- How could we use our facilities for greater community impact?
- Who might we start including, or targeting, in our ministries and programs?
- Where would we direct our members' available volunteer hours and energy?
- How should our 2013 annual church budget change in order to become Mission-driven?

The Mission of the FMC is not rocket science. But it is revolutionary. May we be gripped by these 3 phrases as individuals and as congregations. Let's each pray for fresh eyes and open hearts to what God desires to do IN us and THROUGH us this fall, that we might experience the thrill of joining God in changing the world, one person at a time.

BISHOPS' VISION CAST: FIRST of THREE PARTS

The Aug 26th Vision Cast, and the upcoming two broadcasts, will present a **total of nine Practical Strategies** for how we as Free Methodists can uniquely live out our Mission to LOVE GOD, LOVE PEOPLE, and DISCIPLE OTHERS. Three of those nine Practical Strategies were introduced on August 26th and they are summarized below. It is our challenge as individuals and as congregations to creatively <u>implement</u> these priorities in our unique settings.

- 1. Increase church planting and ministries in urban centers (go where people are in greater concentrations in order to bless them and influence society)
- 2. Every congregation needs to become more inclusive by **reaching out to those around you who are different from you** economically, ethnically, socially, age bracket or life station, etc.
- 3. Make sure **daily discipleship and serving are given as much attention** as what we do inside our churches on Sunday morning (a congregation's "success" is more than the quality of the preacher's sermons or the style of its worship music or its internal programs it's about the transformation of our lives and our impact upon the world around us)

LISTENING TO the Vision Cast is a great way to begin, but it cannot stop there. In order to move from LISTENING to IMPLEMENTING in your area, the following suggestions might prove helpful:

- A sermon series, focusing upon one Strategic Priority weekly, providing Biblical foundations
- Coordinate with Sunday School, small group or Sunday PM venues, by possibly reviewing the corresponding segment of the Vision Cast and **discussing together** what implementing that priority in your specific setting might look like. Here is a starter question for Wks 1 3:
 - 1. How might we get involved in an urban ministry near us, or what existing ministry in our town or county could we partner with to bless a greater number of people?
 - 2. Take a fresh look at your congregation and then look at your local community what groups exist "out there" that are not yet being touched by your congregation?
 - 3. How are we discipling new believers, and how are we challenging "not-so-new believers" to grow deeper? How could we make it easier for those in our congregation to serve others outside the walls of our church?
- Share Stories Sunday AM have adults, teens & kids share "ah-ha" moments, experiences of reaching out to someone different from them, or ways they served during the past week

The Mission of the FMC and the nine Strategic Priorities are not a "passing fad." They are the historical heartbeat of our denomination, and the creative ways we are exploring what Personal and Social Holiness look like in the 21st Century. It's not rocket science, so let's join in.

The next Vision Cast will take place Feb. 10, 2013; anticipate Strategic Priorities 4 – 6.

ANNUAL ON PURPOSE REVIEW & PLANNING EVENT

It's important to periodically step back and take a fresh look at what we're doing and give ourselves permission to make changes and try new things. That's what the **Annual On Purpose Process** is all about. It's a time (preferably a weekend, or two separate meetings), where your pastor, BOA, and ministry leaders evaluate the past year, and then prayerfully come before God for His fresh guidance for the coming year. Each church in the southeast region is to complete the **Annual On Purpose Process** before establishing their 2013 Budget or 2013 Church Calendar.
