CHOOSING OUR LEADERS

This fall the news has been filled with contentious candidate ads, party accusations and political debates. In the midst of this, we are to remain focused citizens who prayerfully consider the character and specific plan of action each nominee will bring to their office if elected, be it at the state or national level. When the polls close on Tuesday Nov 6 and our duly elected leaders are announced, our part will not be over. It then becomes our responsibility to continue praying for our elected leaders - that they will lead wisely and humbly, serving well the people over whom they govern. And in the months to come our attitudes and words should reflect respect for our leaders' initiatives whenever possible, as Scripture reminds us that we are citizens of two worlds.

This past week, I received an announcement from a church which is already making plans to positively respond to the national election on Nov. 6:

On Election Day, we should VOTE at the POLLS, but later that evening, let us GATHER to WORSHIP & SHARE COMMUNION.

There we will be reminded that freedom - true freedom - is only given by God and it is indeed not free. It comes with a cost and it looks like a cross.

There we will be reminded that real power in this world - the power to save, to transform, to change - ultimately rests not in political parties or presidents or protests, but in the life, the death, and the resurrection of Jesus.

There we will be reminded that, through the Holy Spirit, this power dwells within otherwise ordinary people who as one body are to continue the mission of Jesus: preaching good news to the poor, freeing the captives, giving sight to the blind, releasing the oppressed, and proclaiming the year of the Lord's favor (Luke 4:16-21).

There we will be reminded that the only Christian nation in this world is the Church, a holy nation that crosses all human-made boundaries and borders.

During the coming weeks of Thanksgiving and Advent, let us look for opportunities to share the reasons that God's Son is the only One worthy in whom to place our trust - for He is the Awaited One, the infinitely Wise One, the Prince of Peace, and the Hope of the World.

2013 PENSION & WAVE CHANGES

This fall Supt Darrel explained changes that will go into effect on January 1st, regarding monthly WAVE and PENSION payments. NOW IS THE TIME TO BE ON-PURPOSE

November - December is the time of year for each congregation — its pastor, BOA and ministry leaders — to schedule a time to look back over what has taken place in 2012, and then prayerfully determine bold changes for 2013, in order to more fully serve your community and live out God's unique purpose for your church. Without this important time of reflection, prayer and dreaming together, a church will merely "tread water" instead of moving forward in ministry.

The *Annual On Purpose Process* is a tool for helping your congregation discuss and discern these following aspects of ministry:

- Identifying programs which have lost their effectiveness, and replacing them with new ministries which meet felt needs and deeper needs of those inside & outside the church
- Changing last year's budget categories and amounts, in order to better allocate funds for this coming year's needs and new initiatives
- Determining how existing leaders need to be re-tooled, and which new individuals should be invited into ministries as either new team members or team leaders.

As your congregation focuses upon selecting new leaders, establishing your budget, and expanding ministries to your local community and global church, may your attitudes and words reflect a willingness to set aside personal preferences in order to better reach those who have not yet come to faith or who are struggling with areas of brokenness. INCLUDE GC15 IN YOUR 2013 BUDGET

In July 2015, the FMC-USA General Conference will take place in Orlando FL. This is the first time in the history of our denomination that a General Conference will be held in the southeast, and it is important that EVERY CHURCH commit to sending a delegation to this historic event.

Local church BOAs: begin to budget <u>now</u> to help your Pastor & at least one other leader from your church to attend. Additionally, for the price of weekly saving the money from one pizza or fast food meal (\$10) between Jan 1, 2013 and the end of June 2015, an individual will save \$1,300 – that's more than enough money for 2 adults to share a guest suite for 5 nights at Caribe Royale (separate living room and bedroom), pay for 2 GC15 registrations, and have food money.
