I REMEMBER WHEN...

When recently asked to complete the sentence "I remember when . . ." I thought of some things that made me feel like I used to live on a different planet from the world I live in today. Here are just a few of the things I remember:

- The milkman delivered dairy products and other basic foods to our door early in the morning
- Our family doctor made house calls, and our house was quarantined when my sister got the measles
- I could eat anything I wanted and not gain weight . . . fat grams, carbs and cholesterol didn't exist
- The school day always began with reciting the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer
- People stayed at one job their entire career, working 25 30 years in one place
- TV's were black and white, there were just 3 stations, and Saturday evening there was even a movie on TV
- Telephones were on "party lines," where we had to share a phone line with neighbors
- The term "gas war" meant local gas stations were competing for my business, and I could buy a gallon of gasoline with the change in my pocket 25 cents or less

Wow – that WAS a different era! And I think things have changed in other realms as well. How would you respond if you were asked to complete the sentence "I remember when . . ." in a church context? Perhaps you are old enough to recall the following:

- Going to church on Sunday was something all reputable people did
- There were no "competition options" on Sunday no team sports, stores & theaters were closed, etc.
- Everyone wore their "Sunday best" clothing to church
- Women never wore pants into the church building
- Most women were "homemakers" who were able to volunteer huge amounts of time to church activities
- Churches had large attendances on Sunday morning, Sunday evening, Wednesday nights and for revivals
- Everyone read from the same translation of the Bible the King James version
- Sanctuaries often had choir lofts where singers sat, dressed in uniform robes

In thinking about upcoming Easter Services, I can't help but wonder if our churches will be visited by the CEO (Christmas and Easter Only) crowd. I hope so . . . I pray so.

- For those CEOs who have NO MEMORY of church to recall, I wonder what has prompted them to bravely step into unfamiliar territory. What will they experience a friendly welcome and immediate friendship? Music that lifts their spirit? A message that speaks to their personal need for hope and strength?
- For those CEO's who have only BAD MEMORIES of church, I wonder what has caused them to risk giving us a "second chance." Will we take the initiative to accept them warmly? As they observe our interactions, will their defenses relax? As they participate in the worship service, will they find anything that relates to them and their problems?

This Easter, this Annual Conference meeting, and this coming year, I want us to continually CHECK our FOCUS. Let's not be fixated upon how we did things in the past, but let's focus upon present realities. And let's pay at least as much attention – or more – to those OUTSIDE the walls of our church, as we do to our regular attendees INSIDE our fellowship. Maybe then we'll experience more of the RESURRECTION JOY Jesus came to offer us all.

AFTER EASTER, WHAT?

PASTORS: Often there is so much focus upon planning the Easter Service, that there is little energy or creativity put into giving new attenders a reason to come back after Easter. See if one or more of these options might be something you could promote on Easter Sunday:

- New Sermon Series to run the Sundays after Easter Memorial Weekend
- **Spring Garage Sale** everyone contributes and the profits are donated to a local charity
- **Children's Events** promote a Vacation Bible School, Music Day Camp, Sports Clinic, or Bicycle Safety Workshop.
- Walk, Run or Bike Event (you choose the venue) to raise awareness for a national or global issue (Not for Sale, etc.)
- Weekly Youth Activities and upcoming Spring or Summer Outings and Events
- **Community Service Day** opportunities for families to return and be a part of a "Spring Makeover" Day to beautify a nearby park, volunteer at a local food pantry, or bless a senior citizen with free home & yard help.
- **Create Family Memories** organize simple reasons to gather generationally and have fun: Fishing Tourney Day, Old Fashioned Picnic Day, Bike Hike, etc.
- A **short term small group** based upon an affinity connection (i.e. book study for young parents) or specific support (coaching the unemployed or underemployed, etc.)

VBS CURRICULUM HAS MANY USES

Vacation Bible School Curriculum can be re-formatted, or recycled, in many helpful ways, so talk to the churches around you, seeing what you can share, swap, and refurbish for maximum mileage.

- Offer a traditional VBS five days in a row, one week in the morning or in the evening
- Take the 5 lessons, and hold VBS one day a week for 5 7 weeks (possibly add an Initial Kick-off Fun & Registration Day, and / or a closing Finale Celebration event.
- Use the 5 lessons as a 10 week summer Sunday School alternative curriculum (divide each VBS lesson into 2 weeks of Sunday School)
- Utilize a VBS kit during the School Year as a Sunday night or Wednesday night 10 wk series)
