Pastors: Please distribute to your delegates, ministry leaders & congregation

"ARE YOU ENTHUSIASTIC?"

I've noticed over the years that whether I am leading a board meeting, building a partnership with a civic organization, or preaching in Sunday worship, that merely sharing facts or information is not enough. Sincerity . . . passion . . . creativity are needed to capture the attention and imaginations of the persons with whom I am sharing. I'm not talking about "hype" here – trying to manipulate others' emotions to get a desired result. No, I'm talking about something much deeper. I'm talking about understanding ENTHUSIASM. Do you know the meaning of this word? In the Greek, *entheos* means *in God*, or *God-inspired*. Webster defines ENTHUSIASM as *"special revelations of the Holy Spirit; something inspiring zeal & fervor.*" I believe that when we, as believers, live ENTHUSIASTICALLY - in the flow of the Spirit - that others are touched at a profoundly deep level, and something new and redeeming can be birthed.

This spring at Annual Conferences, I distributed the book FORGOTTEN GOD to all pastors, and challenged them to not only read the book, but to also begin exploring with their leaders their understanding of the Holy Spirit. The **Red Alert** implementation task assigned to every church leadership team was two-fold: First, identify one or two specific ways that your congregation has not yet "grown up" and been transformed by the Spirit, and start addressing those areas head-on. Secondly, seek the Spirit's guidance and empowerment to boldly invade your local community in one or more creative ways to meet a need and create pathways to wholeness for broken people and broken situations.

We heard stories at Annual Conference and SAC Regional Training Events of Spiritinspired adventures to bring the Kingdom of God to others. Edifying Lives congregation in Boca Raton has bought a house and "moved into the neighborhood" to minister to the local community. Ocala Bread of Life is exploring a partnership with an international food relief organization to feed families in the projects near them. Young couple Ryan & Ester (Grullon) Ramirez are serving as missionaries to urban apartment dwellers through the Apartment Life* ministry, offering friendship & faith to their neighbors.

So I ask you – are you ENTHUSIASTIC? Can't wait to hear your story of what has been happening IN you and THROUGH you as you allow the Spirit to freely move.

APARTMENT LIFE CARE TEAMS*

Did you know 50% of people in major cities live in apartments, 95% don't attend a church, and 50% do not have any friends in their community? Apartment dwellers are a huge mission field stateside. The evangelical urban ministry known as Apartment Life places a Care Team (a Christian team of 2 – a family, married couple or 2 single adults), in an apartment rent free, and asks them to spend 15 hours weekly interacting with their neighbors – building relationships and sharing the Gospel. CHILD SAFETY & WORKER TRAINING REMINDER

The recent tragedy at Penn State involving Jerry Sandusky reminds us that young people are sexually vulnerable, and that guidelines for working with children and teens in <u>any</u> setting are needed. Two guides are included with this month's newsletter. Each and every congregation is to read and follow the provided information. SUMMER & KIDS: A GREAT TIME FOR LOCAL OUTREACH & MISSIONS

Many congregations will provide special events for children this summer – a Vacation Bible School program, Day Camp, an alternative Sunday School ministry, etc. During July and August, make sure to provide children with the opportunity to SERVE as well as BE SERVED. The best memory your child might have of summer could well be when they "made a difference" in someone else's life.

A few local options to get you thinking:

- Summer yard or garage clean-up of a local senior citizen, followed by a stop for ice cream or a pool party.
- Go as a group to a local senior center or nursing home, and host a patriotic or other themed party
- Donate games & DVDs, and decorate doors of a local Ronald McDonald House

A few <u>global ideas</u>:

- Over a 4 week period, have weekly object lessons using water & discuss the problem of clean water in Haiti. Set a goal of raising funds for water filters (\$50 each). Have a concluding water carnival day to celebrate reaching your goal.
- Have a Bible Reading Marathon for Missions. Children sign up sponsors who will donate \$ for each chapter of the Bible they read over a set period of time. (Suggest key chapters of OT, book of Mark, etc.). Money raised can go to a FMWM project.

ICCM CHURCH ACTION KITS

International Childcare Ministries mailed each congregation a CHURCH ACTION KIT in May – remember that white mailing packet? Pastor or Missions Champion: if you haven't opened it yet – do so now and preview the DVD, then use the 8 short clips during the coming school year in worship services, small groups, youth & children's ministries. ICCM is child sponsorship, but it is also so much more – join the fight against human trafficking, provide youth hostels & daycares for the homeless, feeding programs for the hungry, etc.
